
iTongue: Our Multilingual Future

Instructions for use of <u>Windows Live Movie Maker</u> in preparing videos for decoded products.



 When you open Windows Live Movie Maker it will open a working space which looks like this:



- To start creating your video, **add a title**. To do so just go to 'Toolbar' and press on 'Title'. Choose any background color that you like going to 'Text tools -> Format'. That is the place where you can choose your background color, modify shrift format or size.
- **To add another slide** just press on 'Title' again and in order to start typing press on 'Caption'.
- To add pictures, click on 'Home' page, then 'Add videos and photos', a new window will appear; select the photos that you may want to use. Once you have selected them,

immediately you will be able to see all the photo content or that you just added. Click the play button to see how your movie will look like.



• To add animation and visual effects use the toolbar showed below, use 'Transitions' and 'Visual effects'.



- **To add music** in the video, just go to 'Home' page, press on 'Add music', find the file in the computer and press 'Open'. If it is necessary or you like to you can always modify music volume by pressing on 'Music volume'.
 - You can modify when the music starts or finishes by going to 'Music tools -> Options' and pressing on 'Start point' (to modify when the music starts) or 'End point' (to modify when the music finishes).
- If you want **to record your own voice** and use it to explain the slides just go to 'Home' page and press on 'Record narration' and press 'Record'. You can stop, cancel or start all over again any time you want.
 - In order to play the background music and explanation of the slides at the same time, split the music by going to 'Narration Tools -> Options' and pressing on 'Split'. Turn down the music volume when the voice starts explaining the slides and turn it up again when the explanation is finished.

• Play your movie to see how it will look like, once you are happy with your creation, "save as a movie" and you can play it as a normal video with any program, if you "save as a project" you can modify the video when you open it in Movie Maker.
