Kick-Off meeting 14th – 17th Nov. 2013 in Germany

Dear Partners,

here some information for you to get ready for the meeting.

Travel facilities

In order to avoid anyone getting lost with luggage on a complicated itinerary with changes between the airport and the hotel in the mountains of the Black Forest (or being charged over 130€ for taxi) we organized the bus as a common taxi for all of you at 17:00 from the airport directly to the hotel for the costs of public transport.

Those who will arrive much earlier at the airport may benefit from the direct tube for visiting the center of Stuttgart. See details below.

Meeting facilities

To make sure we meet efficiently, I would like to pick up Bea's initiative. As the Hungarian group will be the biggest at this meeting, Bea has sent 2 or 4 lines about each of their participants describing briefly the competences, activities and engagements of each person as well as their expectations and possible contributions towards the project.

I consider this "presentation round on paper" to be really helpful. Rushing through the presentation of 40 people at the beginning of the meeting, while struggling with language barriers, won't allow retaining much information. So you may already know when arriving with who you wish to sit at the dinner table!

Objectives

Talking helps, as long as you can refer to the experiences others have. As iTongue is something entirely new, we will practice the practicalities together until every one actually will have produced something during the meeting and finally really know what we are talking about. This will allow laying down our agreement on the project methodological baselines. We will then go through the website and also make sure you are equipped for carrying out your own iTongue research and for running local iTongue courses.



Suggestions for popping into Stuttgart

take S-Bahn (tube) S2 or S3 to the centre
after 28 minutes leave at Hauptbahhof (main train station) (1)

Walk from its letf corner (1) to its right corner (2) where you enter the Königsstraße (22) This is Stuttgart's main shopping pedestrian road

Walk up the Königsstraße (22) until Schlossplatz where you will find:

- (20) Kunstverein with various art exhibitions www.wkv-stuttgart.de
- (24) Kunstmuseum (art gallery) currently with a Willi Baumeister exibition www.kunstmuseum-stuttgart.de
- (24) Café Cube if you want to enjoy the view www.cube-restaurant.de
- (18) Altes Schloss with (17) Landesmuseum Württemberg, currently exhibition "Glanz der Zaren" about the *Romanows* in Baden-Württemberg <u>www.landesmuseum-</u> <u>stuttgart.de/ausstellungen/im-glanz-der-zaren</u>
- (16) Markthalle (*market hall* with lots of stalls) www.markthalle-stuttgart.de/

If you continue walking up the Königsstraße, there will be big **shopping centers** (Karstadt, Beuninger)

If you like *wearing fiber from natural sources*, PeterHahn is famous for quality and ellegance (13) Hirschstraße 2 <u>www.peterhahn.de/damen</u>

Entering the Stadtpark (20) you may walk along the Staatstheater (5) *back to the station*.


